Welcome to the Sixth Form at Stockport Grammar School. CARE, CHARACTER AND COMMUNITY

Stockport Grammar offers exceptional teaching and guidance to prepare pupils for the opportunities which lie ahead. Every year we welcome students from state and independent schools to join us for the two years of Sixth Form.

We offer small class sizes with 15 students in each form group. Combine this with outstanding co-curricular and personal development opportunities and you'll not only enjoy yourself and make long lasting friendships, but you will also have the best possible foundation for life beyond school. Our students achieve exceptional results and with our support are able to progress to their first-choice universities and careers.

Our Sixth Form offers the opportunity to make a strong start in three or four subjects, supported in small groups containing students passionate about their subjects who are inspired by gifted teachers. The phased transition to independent study possible within the framework of

the school environment adeptly balances structure with a new dynamic, giving Sixth Formers more flexibility in their timetable and the opportunity to choose alongside A Levels academically enhancing opportunities such as the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

Central to the benefit gained from Sixth Form at SGS is the individualised support given in preparing students for application to university or other next steps, such as apprenticeships. The expertise and wise counsel offered from the Careers department to each student and from their UCAS Adviser ensures that at every step of the journey, there is a familiar face to guide, reassure, advise and assist.

There are many opportunities to work collaboratively and take on leadership roles, including the Model United Nations programme, Young Enterprise, and the Duke of Edinburgh Award, alongside a host of sporting, musical, theatrical and many more co-curricular activities. Sixth Formers may also become Prefects, helping younger pupils and staff with the smooth running of the school and taking responsibility for specific areas including Houses and Charities.



BEYOND *THE* CLASSROOM

Supporting children in their own personal development is at the heart of what we do. An exceptional number and variety of co-curricular opportunities in sport, music, drama, academic societies, outdoor pursuits and trips nurture the talents of individual students, help to produce well-rounded young people and enrich the life of our community.

At our clubs and activities fair in early September, we encourage all new pupils to join in and challenge themselves by trying a range of activities. This is an excellent opportunity for them to make friends, extend their comfort zones and maybe even open the door to a life-long passion.

Our visits, trips, language exchange and outdoor activity programmes are well established and widely enjoyed both in term time and during the holidays. SGS adventures range across the UK and across the globe and details of forthcoming trips are available on the website to help pupils and parents plan ahead.

Pupils generally choose between trips on the basis of interest and cost. For a child in receipt of a bursary, the school may contribute towards the cost of certain trips.

Studying A Levels equips students with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to thrive in higher education, the workplace, and beyond. These qualifications offer depth and challenge, encouraging students to think critically, analyse complex ideas, and develop independent learning habits that will serve them for life.

In 2025, our pupils achieved an amazing set of results. With a 100% pass rate, 75% of grades were from A* - B and 41% were at the highest grades of A* - A.

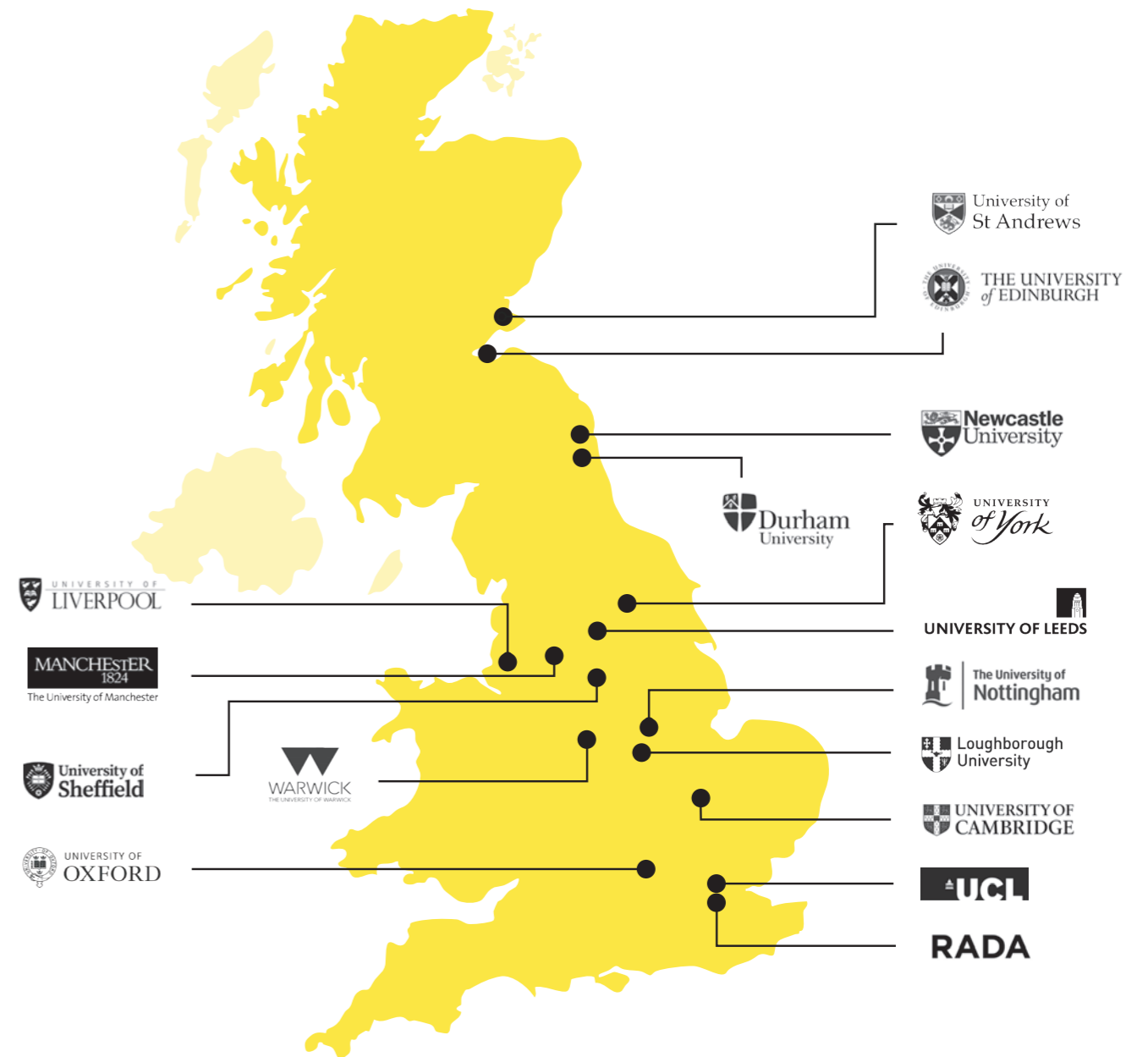

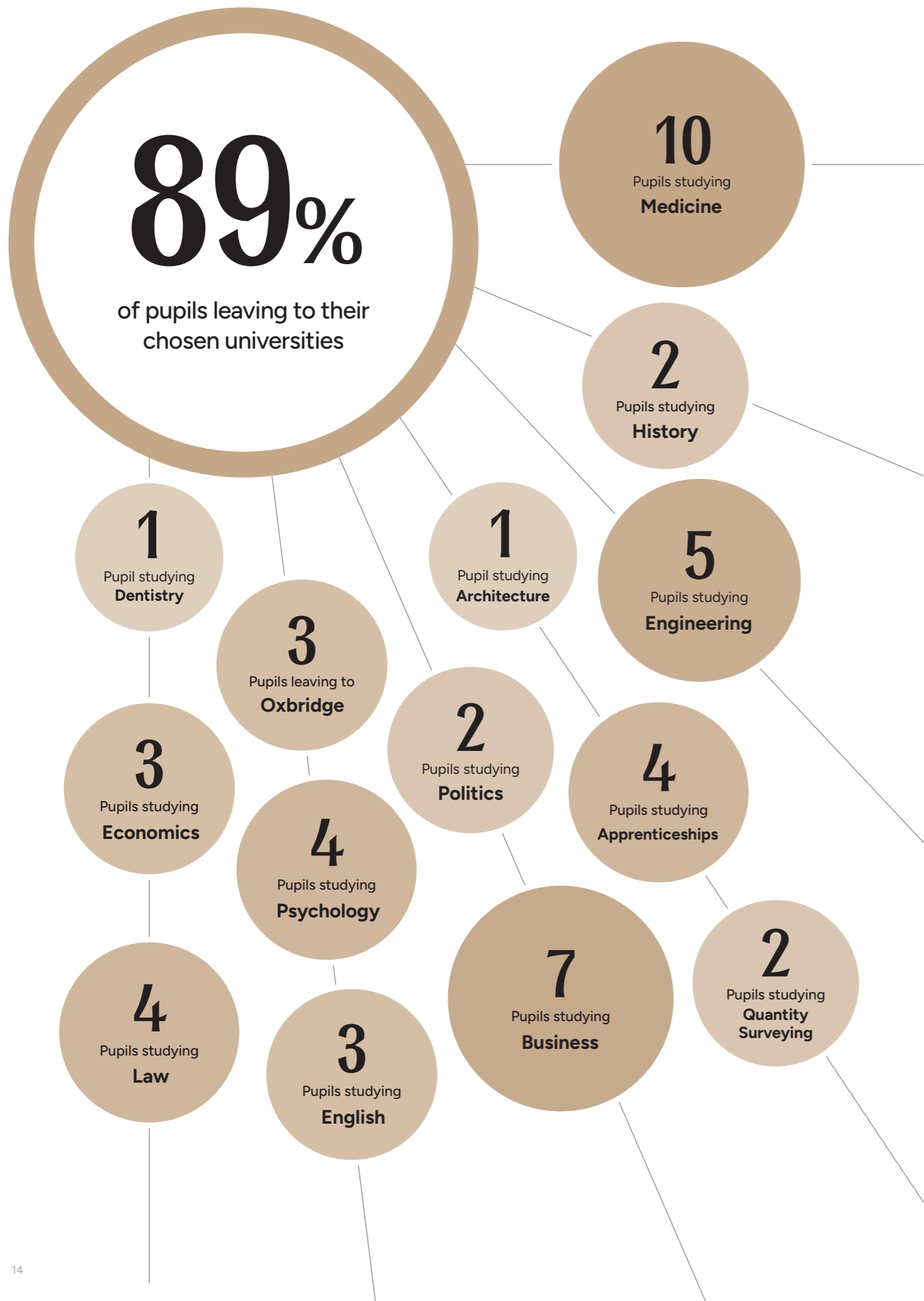

SIXTH FORM STUDY SPACES

SIXTH FORM ADMISSIONS

Entrance examination

The 11+ entrance examination for admission to First Year in September 2026 takes place on Tuesday 13th January 2026. The closing date for applications is Friday 5th December 2025. Please see the entrance examination page on our website for more details of the format of the exam.

Post-examination meeting

An informal meeting forms the final stage of the admissions procedure. Those invited for a post-examination meeting will be notified by email within two weeks of the entrance exam. You and your child will meet with a member of the senior management team.

Offer of a place

If your child is offered a place, you will be notified on Tuesday 24th February 2026. The deadline for acceptance of the offer of a place will be on Thursday 5th March 2026.

You will be given the opportunity to visit the school again after places have been offered.

Entry to other years

Where vacancies arise, we are pleased to welcome children into Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. Children will be asked to take an assessment and references will also be sought from your child's current school.

Sixth Form

Every year we welcome students from state and independent schools to join us for the two years of Sixth Form. Applicants and their parents will be invited for an interview with Head Mrs Sarah Capewell and Head of Sixth Form Mr David Stone. Applicants may be offered a place subject to expected GCSE grades being achieved and a suitable reference from the applicant's current school.

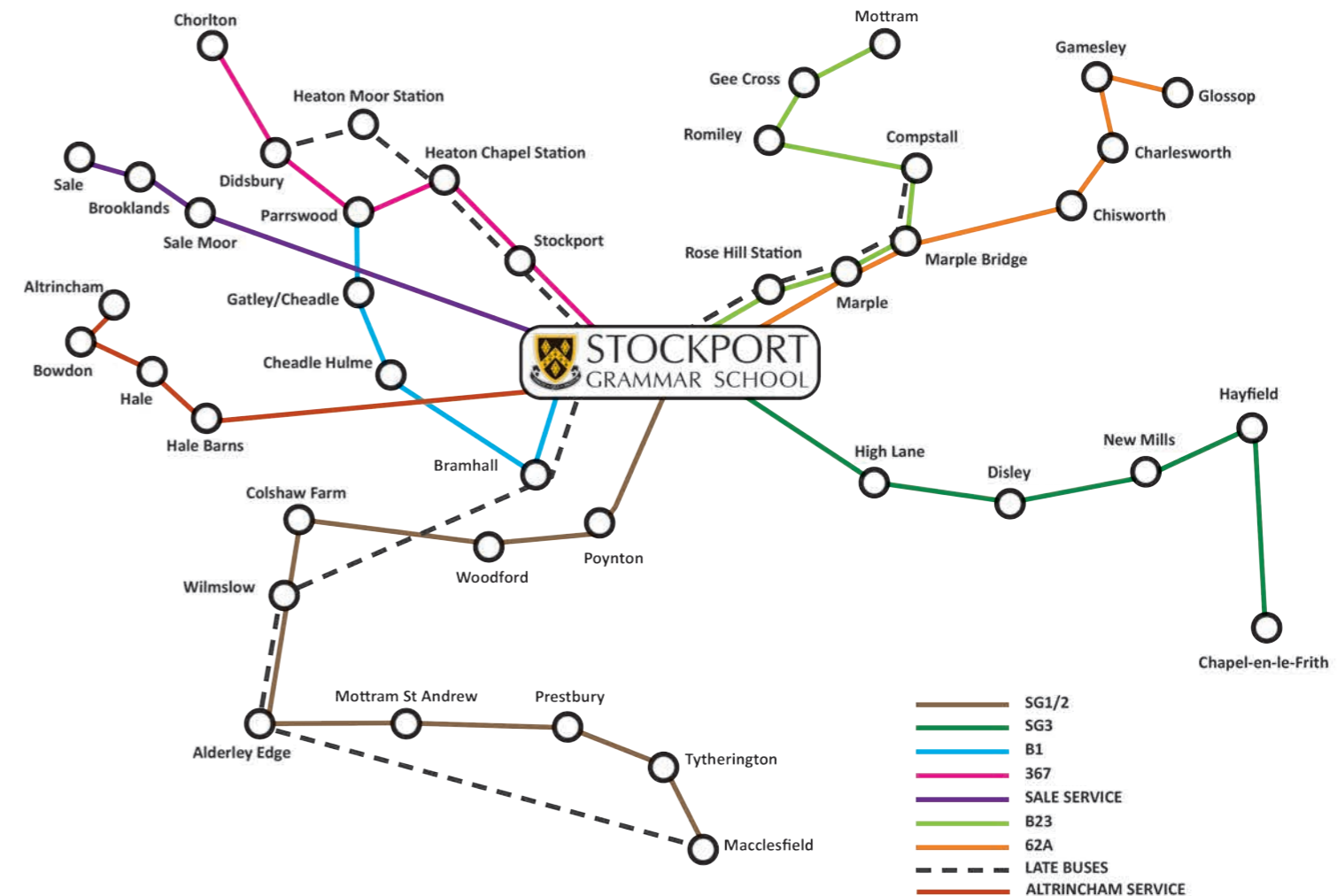

SCHOOL LIFE

School Hours

Senior School morning registration is at 8.40am but pupils may arrive from 7.45am when the school site opens. The Library opens at 8am and breakfast is available to purchase in the Dining Hall. There are 5 periods of lessons per day, with lessons alternating on a two week Blue Week/Yellow Week timetable. Lunch is from 12.25pm to 1.40pm to allow plenty of time to eat, take a break and enjoy co-curricular activities. The school day ends at 3.50pm but the school site remains open to pupils to 6pm so they can take part in further co-curricular activities and use the school library and other study spaces.

Meals

We are committed to ensuring our pupils are provided with nutritious, appetising and wholesome meals. We provide a comprehensive menu offering a range of healthy meals to satisfy all requirements and palates. Please let us know if your child has a food allergy or a special dietary requirement. We are a nut-free site, any food containing nuts is prohibited.

Transport

Our location just off the A6 and its proximity to Woodsmoor and Davenport railway stations means that we are well served by private school bus services, public buses and rail.

Private School Buses

We have an extensive network of private school buses.

361 from Glossop and Disley.

The 378 from Bramhall stops at Davenport railway station, a short walk away.

Trains

Woodsmoor and Davenport railway stations are both a short walk from the school. The stations are on the Manchester to Buxton line with stops including Stockport, Whaley Bridge, Disley and Hazel Grove.

Stockport station is 1.5 miles north of the school and is easily reached with frequent bus services including the 192.

ISI INSPECTION

We are delighted to share the results of our Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI) Routine Inspection Report from November 2023. Our school was one of the first in the North West to be inspected under the new ISI Inspection Framework which does not give one-word gradings.

THE INSPECTORS COMMENTED

"Teaching is stimulating and elicits enthusiastic responses from the pupils. Adults provide pupils from a young age with a strong foundation in speaking, listening, literacy and numeracy skills."

"Pupils value the chances leaders provide to engage with their local community and with charitable endeavours, showing pride in the contributions they make."

FEES AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

School fees cover the cost of tuition, examination entries, textbooks, and most co-curricular activities.

2025/2026 School Year

Senior School and Sixth Form fees: £4,995 per term

Junior School: £3,857 per term

Nursery: £3,649 per term (if attending full time)

The fees stated do not include VAT.

Early Years Funding is available for pupils who are eligible. For further information please contact the Junior School.

Payment method

School fees can be paid by direct debit, either termly or three times per term.

Financial advice

Stockport Grammar School does not give financial or investment advice. You may wish to take advice from your own financial advisor or one of the companies who offer specialist advice as to the best way to plan the costs of long-term fee payment.

Lunch

Every child stays for lunch, except Nursery children not attending a full day. Lunch is charged for separately per term.

Bursaries

Shaa scholarships

We offer a small number of scholarships each year based on outstanding performance in the entrance examination. A Shaa scholarship gives a reduction of £1,000 on each full year's fees and is held for the pupil's first five years in the senior school, subject to an annual progress review.

You do not need to apply for a Shaa scholarship and they are not subject to a means test. Offers of Shaa scholarships will be made in the letter sent to parents in March giving the outcome of the entrance examination.

Music scholarships

Two music scholarships are available each year to cover up to 25% of the school fees. Music scholarships are awarded after audition to prospective pupils who have already reached a high standard on one or more instruments and show outstanding musical potential.
